It is planned to introduce panels in the remaining five Districts during the coming year. The aim of all panels is to provide a forum at which people can raise any issue of general concern to their local area.


### **New Year message from our local Police Commander**

Keep an eye on elderly neighbours as criminals do prey on the elderly. Lock your property up and make sure anything with a serial number is logged on the Immobilise website. Report on Scam Activity in Sussex**

During September 2008 East Sussex County Council gathered together evidence of over 460 individual scams which had been reported to the Council's Trading Standards Service. Some of the cases revealed the misery suffered by victims, some of whom had lost thousands of pounds.

In one case a 72 year person had sent nearly £100,000 to American criminals operating a share investment plan, in another a man living in poverty had sent regular payments all over the world after being promised that he would win a fortune, The latter case only came to light after the gentleman had been taken into care.

It is estimated that scams cost the UK about £3.5 billion a year.

Trading Standards are appealing to anyone who has been told they have won a prize to **STOP** and **THINK** before sending any money.

## Debt Letters

**Doing the rounds recently has been a letter purporting to come from a debt collection agency based in the Czech Republic.**

Use some common sense if you receive one of these or a similar one in the future. The letter will normally contain the fictitious name of the company who have reported you together with equally dubious account and reference numbers together with the amount you supposedly owe. In any event if you really did have an outstanding debt then long before a recovery agency becomes involved the company you purchased the goods or services from would have written to you on a number of occasions. Please do not be tempted to telephone any of the numbers supplied as this is basically a premium rate telephone scam. The clue in this particular letter was the phrase, 'Due to very high call volumes you may experience intermittent connection problems to our call centre. Please continue calling until your call is connected to a call operator'. Naturally they want you to keep trying to contact them – that's how they make their money.

**Remember this** – Just because a strange company writes to you and says you have a debt doesn't necessarily mean that you do.

## Internet Auction Site Frauds

Without doubt the largest number of Internet related crime complaints received by the Sussex Police are in relation to these types of transactions.

It is important to state that buying and selling items through most of these sites is intrinsically safe but only if you follow the rules. Deviate from them and you will find yourself in a minefield.

Think of your own local community. Now wouldn't it be nice if everyone was honest and trustworthy? Well the same applies to these auction sites. They can only reflect the world they serve and are populated by both heroes and villains. It is essential, therefore, that you read and understand each auction sites terms and conditions. Above all you must understand that this type of deal is a transaction between strangers. Despite their good efforts eBay can't protect users if they ignore the rules.

Remember this – In the case of Internet auction sites 'rules are not for bending'. They are designed to safeguard you and your money.

**Do not breakaway from them.**

**Reporting Incidents**

Generally speaking the standard of our reporting of incidents is still not as good as it might be.

Please always remember the golden rule-

Crime in progress or about to happen—Call 999

Concern or recent incident ---Call 0845 60 70 999

The Neighbourhood Watch Police Support Office (NWPSO) telephone number 01323 414218 should NOT be used to report incidents of criminal activity because-

- a. The desk is only staffed on a voluntary part time basis
- b. The desk officers have no direct access to the Police Control room which records all reported incidents for future reference.

The NWPSO number should be used to obtain advice on NW administrative matters such as who to contact about non-criminal problems and the placing of NW Street Signs.
